Well Woman HealthCheck

The Well Woman HealthCheck Program helps individuals who were born biologically female have access to breast and cervical cancer screenings.

Eligible clients receive clinical breast exams, mammograms, pap tests, and pelvic exams. Diagnostic exams like ultrasounds, biopsies and other tests are also available if indicated. Referral assistance is provided for treatment if needed.
